PARENTPAY ITEMS

Lunches

The cost of lunches for the half term is \pm 74.10 (8th January – 16th February 2024).

Payments need to be paid in advance and we are currently have to chase those accounts going into debt. Please make sure you check your child's account regularly. Please remember that we require 2 weeks' notice in writing (email) from a parent/carer if you wish to change your child's lunch arrangements.

Reception Snacks

Reception snacks for the half term are £7.50. Payments can be made via Parent Pay.

Year 6 Residential – Kingswood, Colomendy – October 2024

The payment schedule for the Year 6 residential to Kingswood, Colomendy in October 2024 is as follows

- First payment of £50 by 26th January 2024
- Second payment of £70 by 22nd March 2024
- Third payment of £78.50 by 7th June 2024

These payments can be made any time up to the deadlines as they are active on ParentPay now. If you have any questions about payments, please speak to a member of office staff.

Lunch box reminder

We have been pleased to see some very healthy lunchboxes in school so far this term. May we ask that sweet treats (biscuits, chocolate biscuits etc) are limited to ensure children have a range of food to eat and to limit the amount of sugar they may be consuming. As we are a nut free school, items in lunch boxes should contain no nuts.

Snacks and drinks reminder

Children in Years 1-6 are welcome to bring a snack to eat at breaktime. As we are a nut free school, snacks should contain no nuts and should be healthy e.g. fruit, rice cakes NOT crisps, chocolate bars etc.

Please can children bring a named bottle in to school which should only contain plain or flavoured still water NOT juice, cordial etc.

Mobile Phones

Please could we remind parents that Year 3 - 6 children may bring a mobile phone to school if it is required to keep the children safe travelling to and from school. In line with our safeguarding policy, children know that phones **MUST NOT** be switched on whilst on the school premises. School takes no responsibility for children's phones.
