Curriculum

Topics and lessons are planned to develop a deep contextual understanding and **love of learning** and allow children to commit knowledge to **long term memory**.

Effective and **engaging** classroom environments support and enrich the children's learning experiences and **celebrate** their achievements.

Horwich Parish is a school with a tradition of high standards of behaviour from it's children. We expect children to be punctual, polite and of a smart appearance.

We foster all the Christian values and in particular in line with our mission statement, love and respect.

We teach children to treat others as they would like to be treated.

Pupils behave well and they are enthusiastic learners. They want to succeed. They respect each other and have a good understanding of British values.

We have several councils that children serve on if they are elected to do so by their class.

Behaviour

Our School Council and Safety Council consist of two elected members from each year group from Year 2 to 6. Meetings allow pupils to make a positive contribution towards the running of the school.

Our Eco Council meet weekly and run our school allotment. The children grow fresh vegetables which are served as part of our school meal system and sell their produce to the school community. We also have our very own Horwich Parish chickens! Our worship group meet weekly to plan and evaluate worship in school.

The school elects a Head boy/girl, Deputy Head boy/girl and Prefects at the beginning of every academic year. They represent the school, support the work of the school and help make decisions on the running of the school.



Safeguarding is a priority in the school. Robust systems are in place, they are shared with parents, and all staff understand them.

Developing a Growth Mindset can help to remove invisible barriers to learning as pupils begin to realise that we can all grow in our abilities through hard work, perseverance and practice.

Children settle quickly into the early years. Staff ensure that they are well cared for and their learning needs are met. OFSTED
